BIBLIOGRAPHY DISTRIBUTION RECORD—PACIFIC 97 EDITION

Edition Date: 11-MAY-1997 (Most copies of this edition were incorrectly dated 11 May 1992, the year date of the previous edition).

This was the 5th and last printed edition of the bibliography. It is called the PACIFIC 97 Edition because it was prepared for submission to the philatelic literature competition of PACIFIC 97, the United States International Philatelic Exhibition held in San Francisco, California, May 29 to June 8, 1997.

A one-sided master was printed from the electronic copy of this edition from which a two-sided master was generated for printing additional photocopies. A total of 26 double-sided copies of this edition of the bibliography were printed. Two copies of the bibliography were sent to PACIFIC 97. I retain copy No.26 in my library plus the one-sided and two-sided masters in case additional copies ever need to be printed. Unfortunately, I have misplaced the distribution records for this edition, but have been able to reconstruct it partially from my correspondence and sales records. The sale price of this edition was USD \$50.

After the PACIFIC 97 Edition of the bibliography I decided that the market for this type of work was too limited to warrant further hardcopy printing of the bibliography and instead made it available through the Internet free of charge to the whole World at its current Website: <http://www.philat.com/biblio>. This Website was inaugurated around March 6, 1998.

Since then, I have continued to maintain the bibliography on an ad hoc basis in its Website as time permits. I have also continued to submit the bibliography to subsequent International Philatelic Exhibitions, but only in softcopy form via CD or as a Website entry.
